## Dear Chairman Sanders and Ranking Member Cassidy:

As organizations committed to improving and protecting y g'r wdrkeøu'j gcny .'we write to express our serious concern regarding language in the Bipartisan Primary Care and Health Workforce Act that would cut \$980 million from the Prevention and Public Health Fund (Prevention Fund). This will put Americans at greater risk for illnesses, injuries, and preventable deaths. We ask you to reject any cuts to the Prevention Fund as you work to reauthorize health programs.

The nation can no longer afford to underfund public health. In addition to losing more than one million Americans to COVID-19, the pandemic will likely have cost the U.S. economy \$14 trillion. The nation spends more than \$4.3 trillion annually on health, yet only about 4.4 percent of that total represents spending on public health and prevention. Despite spending more than any other high-income nation on treating disease, the U.S. has substantially worse health outcomes, with life expectancy declining in recent years. Now is the time to invest in public health and prevention.

The Prevention Fund currently comprises more than 10 percent of the Centers for Disease Eqptqn'cpf 'Rtgxgptqp@u'\*CDC) entire annual operating budget. Cuts to the Prevention Fund will translate into funding shortfalls in programs that states have long relied upon to keep their residents healthy and safe. In its first 14 years (FY2010-23), the Prevention Fund has invested more than \$12.3 billion in resources to states, localities, and tribal and community organizations in support of critical prevention and public health programs. These investments include the 317 immunization program that enables prevention of outbreaks, epidemiologists and public health laboratory grants in every state and territory to detect and investigate outbreaks and prevent further infections, the Preventive Health and Health Services (Prevent) Block Grant that enables states and localities to address their most pressing health concerns, supporting cancer screenings, and other critically important programs. Funding prevention not only saves lives, but it also saves money. Vj g'Rtgxgp\qp'H\ppf\pa'\text{u}'Tips from Former Smokers Campaign alone saved an estimated \$7.3 billion in smoking-related healthcare costs from 2012 to 2018 and helped more than one million Americans quit smoking for good. Public health funding has not kept up with the range of threats that public health must address. For many of these conditions, we know what works, but public health does not have the resources to address these growing health threats.

The Prevention Fund has already been cut by nearly \$13 billion from FY2013-2029. These cuts f q'pqv'lwuv'y tgcvgp'EF Eøu'dwf i gv."dw'also the ability of Appropriators to maintain funding for the entire Labor-HHS Appropriations bill. As the Committee works toward reauthorizing health programs, we urge you to avoid cuts to the Prevention Fund and ensure that CDC and public health programs across the country can carry out their mission of saving lives and improving health.
